PJSC MMC Norilsk Nickel's Stakeholder Engagement Policy

1. Scope

This Stakeholder Engagement Policy of PJSC MMC Norilsk Nickel (hereafter referred to as the "Policy") outlines the commitment, principles, and responsibilities of PJSC MMC Norilsk Nickel (hereinafter referred to as the "Company") for stakeholder engagement.

The requirements of this Policy shall be mandatory for Company employees. The Policy provisions shall apply to all corporate business units of the Norilsk Nickel Group in which the stake of more than 50% is directly or indirectly owned by the Company. The Company also expects its contractors and suppliers to observe the principles and provisions of this Policy.

The Policy applies in all the regions where the Company is present, all stages of its production units' activities, including exploration, extraction, smelting, refining, manufacturing of finished products, marketing and sale of non-ferrous and precious metals.

2. Terms, Definitions and Abbreviations

2.1. The following terms apply herein with their respective definitions:

2.1.1. **Stakeholders:** individuals and legal entities, as well as groups and associations and other organizations external to the Company whose interests may be affected by the Company's activities, as well as parties that may influence the Company¹.

2.1.2. **Artisanal and small-scale mining (ASM):** For the purpose of this Policy artisanal and small- scale mining (ASM) is generally understood to encompass a range of activities, including prospecting, exploration, extraction, processing and transportation, and use more simplified and manual labour-intensive technologies and

practices than large-scale industrial mining. "Such activities are often connected with unlawful operations, with harsh working conditions and serious pollution. This is exemplified by the consequences to biodiversity, ecosystem services and health caused by the use of mercury in some processes".²

2.1.3. **Production unit**: divisions of the Company's subsidiaries (mine, plant, factory, etc.) involved in manufacturing the Company's products and rendering services, with their own organizational structure.

2.1.4. **Free, prior and informed consent (FPIC):** the right recognized in the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples that enables indigenous peoples to grant or refuse their consent for the implementation of a project that may affect their interests or territories as well as cultural heritage. FPIC also enables indigenous peoples to agree on the terms and conditions under which a project affecting them will be planned, designed, implemented, monitored and evaluated. The rights of small indigenous peoples in the Russian Federation are guaranteed by the Constitution of the Russian Federation, Federal Law of 30.04.1999 N 82-FZ *On Guarantees of the Rights of Small Indigenous Peoples of the Russian Federation*, Federal Law of 07.05.2001 N 49-FZ *On Territories of Traditional Nature Use by Indigenous Small Peoples of the North, Siberia and the Far East of the Russian Government Order of 04.02.2009* N 132-p *On the Concept of Sustainable Development for Indigenous Small Peoples of the North, Siberia and the Far East of the Russian Federation,* as well as regional legislation.

2.1.5. **Vulnerable Groups:** any group or part of the community with a higher risk of being discriminated against or being subject to other violations of rights, adverse impacts of economic crises, etc., as compared to other groups or the rest of the community.³

3. General Information

The Company's stakeholder engagement activities aim to build mutually beneficial long-term relationships with stakeholders to ensure sustainable development and achieve results that meet the interests of the Company and the stakeholders.

The Company shall routinely monitor the Policy's implementation and shall undertake independent expert assessments of its stakeholder engagement activities. These assessments will review compliance with the current laws and regulations of the Russian Federation and applicable international law as well as the standards of industry associations and initiatives of which the Company is a member⁴.

The Company shall draft an annual Stakeholder Engagement Plan (hereafter referred to as the SEP).

4. Statutory Framework

4.1. The Company shall be guided by the federal and regional laws of the Russian Federation and recognized Russian⁵ and international standards⁶ regarding stakeholder engagement. The Policy is also aligned with the UN Universal Declaration of Human Rights, the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, the International Labour Organization's (ILO) Indigenous and Tribal Peoples Convention (No. 169), the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), International Finance Corporation's (IFC) Performance Standards on Environmental and Social Sustainability, the UN Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights (UNGPs), the GRI and EITI reporting standards as well as the Voluntary Principles on Security and Human Rights (VPSHR). In its engagement with stakeholders, the Company will also observe the

recommendations⁷ of international standards ISO 26000:2010 and AA1000SES (2015) and routinely undertake internal verification of compliance with these standards.

4.2. This Policy shall apply in conjunction with:

- PJSC MMC Norilsk Nickel's Code of Business Conduct;
- PJSC MMC Norilsk Nickel's Environmental Policy;
- PJSC MMC Norilsk Nickel's Environmental Impact Assessment Policy;
- PJSC MMC Norilsk Nickel's Regulation on the Information Policy;
- PJSC MMC Human Rights Policy;
- PJSC MMC Norilsk Nickel's Indigenous Peoples' Rights Policy;
- PJSC MMC Local Community Interaction Policy;
- PJSC MMC Norilsk Nickel's Support for Small and Medium Enterprises Policy;
- PJSC MMC Norilsk Nickel's Regulations on Charity Work.

5. Commitments and Principles

5.1. The Company shall build long-term relationships with the stakeholders based on respect and trust in order to achieve mutual benefit and welfare.

5.2. The Company shall take into account stakeholders opinions, maintain regular communication, request and provide feedback and consult with key⁸ stakeholders in good faith concerning issues related to the Company, including the ESG issues, etc.⁹

5.3. The Company seeks meaningful and transparent settlement of disagreements through dialogue.

5.4. The Company shall hold regular consultations with stakeholders in the form of a systematic and step-by-step interaction throughout the life cycle of the Company's production units in order to prevent or minimize the adverse impacts, taking into account stakeholder opinions when making decisions that influence their lives and ensuring the timely feedback.

5.5. The Company shall disclose in a timely manner relevant information¹⁰ requested by stakeholders in accordance with the standards of the Initiative for Responsible Mining Assurance (IRMA), the commitments of membership with the International Council on Mining and Metals (ICMM) and the other standards accepted by the Company.

5.6. The Company shall systematically interact with all the key stakeholders listed in the SEP including host communities, representatives and associations of indigenous peoples, vulnerable groups and other stakeholder groups¹¹.

5.7. The Company confirms its readiness to ensure the implementation of the principle of free, prior and informed consent (FPIC) where applicable, according to the standards and recommendations of the International Council on Mining and Metals (ICMM)¹² and relevant procedures adopted by the Company.

5.8. The Company shall ensure that stakeholder opinions are submitted and explained to the Company's executives in a manner that makes it possible to take appropriate and timely response action.

5.9. The Company shall maintain an equitable, accessible and efficient grievance mechanism for considering and taking remedial action on stakeholder complaints and grievances at both corporate and production units' levels.

5.10. The Company does not employ child workers nor does it use forced labor or any forms of human trafficking prohibited by Russian laws. The Company takes account of the expectations of the product buyers, investors, associations and initiatives adhered to by the Company, as well as of the other stakeholders pertaining to the responsible sourcing of minerals and metals. This includes providing information as to the observance of the principles of responsible sourcing of minerals and metals verified by an independent third party into its non-financial statements.

7. Monitoring and Evaluation of Policy Implementation

The Company will implement the following measures for the monitoring and evaluation of Policy implementation:

7.1. Monitor the implementation of the annual SEP and its results.

7.2. Carry out annual verification of the efficiency of sustainable development activities including stakeholder engagement for reporting in accordance with the requirements of ICMM, and other reporting standards adopted by Nornickel.

7.3. Commission an independent verification of reporting documents of the Company's major production units every three years, by evaluating the results of stakeholder engagement as per the standard of the ICMM individually for each of the Company's production units.

8. Reporting

8.1. The Company reports on its stakeholder engagement activities in the Company's Sustainable Development Report and Annual Report, as well as in other non-financial reporting on economic, social and environmental performance in accordance with the Global Reporting Initiative (GRI) standards.

8.2. The Company seeks to disclose the information regarding payments to the state authorities relating to the extraction, trade or export of raw materials in

accordance with the requirements of the Extractive Industries Transparency Initiative (EITI).

8.3. The Company takes account of the UN Global Compact and the UN Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights in preparing the reporting documents on its activities on stakeholder engagement.

9. Responsibility

9.1. Responsibility for introduction of amendments and additions to this Policy lies with the Senior Vice President for Sustainable Development.

10. General Provisions

10.1. This Policy is subject to regular review by the Company's Board of Directors (every 5 years or before).
